LEARNING ASSUMED TO BE IN PLACE

It is assumed that the student is competent in the Home Language of choice and English at Senior Certificate Level. The following home languages are offered: isiZulu, isiXhosa, Setswana, Sepedi, English or Afrikaans. Please note that at least 15 students must register before a specific language can be offered. Basic computer literacy will enable students to access the student support actions available.

COMPUTER LITERACY AND REQUIREMENTS

It is expected of all students to have access to a computer device and data/wifi in order to submit all the assignments on Edutel Online.

Information and Communication Technology Skills is a compulsory module of the Diploma in Grade R Teaching. It is important that every student must be computer literate. This module guides you to understand your computer, and the use of Microsoft Word, Excel and PowerPoint. It will also assist you to access the internet, how to use Microsoft Outlook for e-mails and store your information. If you still struggle with computer literacy, we recommend that you attend an additional online computer literacy workshop which will be made available to registered students.

3. Programme Structure: Three-Year Full-Time Distance Programme

PLEASE NOTE:

Edutel Higher Education offers students the option to enrol for the three-year distance programme intended for those students who study full-time via distance learning or the four-year distance learning programme for those students that who work full-time and study part-time through distance learning

Choosing your compulsory Home Language:

Students can choose between the following Home Languages - Afrikaans, English, isiXhosa, isiZulu, Sepedi and Setswana. The compulsory Second Additional Language is determined by the Home Language the student enrolled at Edutel, the language studied in matric, or any previous qualification. In other words, the chosen language must not correlate with:

- The Home Language the student enrolled at Edutel or
- The language the student studied in matric, or
- Any previous qualification the student acquired.

The table below will guide students in selecting their Second Additional Language.

Work-Integrated Learning (WIL)

Work Integrated Learning (WIL) is the term given to educational activities that integrate academic learning of a discipline with its practical application in the workplace. The aim is to ensure that students develop the ability to integrate their learning through a combination of academic and work-related activities.

You, as the student, will be required to select a school in the area where you live and where Grade R is being taught. The school must have an appointed HOD for ECD/Foundation Phase and an EMIS number. Apart from selecting a qualifying school, the school must also make a mentor teacher available to mentor and assess you, during WIL.

Edutel Higher Education reserves the right to approve or not to approve of the selected school. Should Edutel Higher Education not approve of the school, you will be required to select another school, complete the appendices again and submit to Edutel Higher Education.

Once Edutel Higher Education has approved the school it is accepted that you will complete your WIL at the specific school. Should you for some reason wish to change your school, please inform the Registrar of such change, to obtain approval of the new chosen school.

Should you register between 21 June and 20 January, you will be required to do your WIL either in July, August or September. Should you register between 21 January and 20 June you will be required to do your WIL in February or March.

During the 12 weeks' school-based teaching practice (WIL), students engage in teaching within the professional school environment, under the supervision of experienced teachers as mentors, and are formally assessed by suitably qualified assessors of Edutel Higher Education during the last four weeks of school-based teaching practice (WIL) in the third year for full-time distance learners, and in the fourth year for part-time distance learners.

Note:

- **All students enrolled for the three-year full-time distance programme will start with the four weeks of teaching practice (WIL) in the second semester of their first year.**
- **All students enrolled for the four-year part-time programme will start with the four weeks of teaching practice (WIL) in the second semester of their second study year.**

HOW DO YOU STUDY AT EDUTEL HIGHER EDUCATION?

The Diploma in Grade R Teaching is a part-time modular qualification that makes use of a blended mode of learning. This means that students will register for a qualification as a distance student and will work at home on the study material provided, but have at their disposal several ways in which to supplement their studies.

6. Assessment of Students

To assess the achievement of the outcomes of this programme an approach of continuous assessment will be followed. The assessment process has two dimensions/components that complement each other and are integrated, namely formative assessment and summative assessment.

Formative assessment

One three-part compulsory formative assignment per examinable module must be completed and submitted on the Edutel Online platform, namely short questions in Part 1; longer paragraph type questions in Part 2; and a set of 50 multiple-choice questions in Part 3.

The three parts respectively contribute on a 20:50:30 basis to the final assignment mark (i.e. the year mark). These compulsory formative assessment activities will make up your formative mark. This will help you obtain a good formative assessment mark and to adequately prepare for the examination.

For non-examinable modules, assignment Part 1 on Edutel Online will count 20% and assignment Part 2, 50% and Part 3 contribute 30% each, to the final mark. 20:50:30

For examinable modules, final marks carry the following weights:

Non-examinable modules will have three compulsory assessments. Assessment Part 1 makes up/contributes 20%, assessment Part 2 makes up/contributes 50% and the Part 3 makes up/contributes 30%. 20:50:30

A student must achieve at least a sub-minimum of 40% in the formative assessment activities which consist of Part 1 of 40 short questions that count 20%, longer questions that count 50% and the Part 3 makes up/contributes 30%. to qualify to write the examination. The pass mark for all modules is 50%. 20:50:30

Summative assessment

All modules (excluding Second Additional Language modules and the ICT module) will be assessed through a formal examination.

Examinations

If you register between 21 June and 20 January, you will write your first semester examinations during May/June the following year.

Should you register between 21 January and 20 June, you will write your first semester examination during November of the same year.

Requirement to Write Exams

A student must achieve at least a sub-minimum of 40% in the formative assessment activities which consist of assessment Part 1, short questions that counts 20%, Part 2, longer questions that count 50% and Part 3 that count 30% to qualify to write the examination.

7. Rules of Combination

Rules of combination - Diploma in Grade R Teaching

The programme is designed and structured in such a way that it forms an integrated programme, made up of different modules. Provision is made for logical progression from one module to the next and the interrelatedness of the different modules is emphasised continuously by cross-referencing to other modules as the programme unfolds. The interrelatedness of the specialisation modules, fundamental modules and the work-integrated modules (Teaching Practice) is emphasised in all modules.

Progression Modules



Home Languages, First Additional Languages, Second Additional Languages and WIL are presented as progression modules. In sequence, the first module leads to the second module in a predetermined order until the third module is completed.

Students cannot register for a progression, second or third-year module if any first- or second-year progression modules are outstanding. You may still register for any of the other modules offered in the specific year of study.

Students will be allowed to repeat a progression module with the next intake students.

Complying with the requirements for Work Integrated Learning (WIL) modules during all three years of study, is a requirement to complete the qualification.

8. When can I register?

There are two study cycles per academic year. Our cycles are as follows:

Study Cycle 1

Register between 21 January and 20 June. You will write exams on your 1st semester modules in November and your second semester examination in May/June of the following year.

Study Cycle 2

Register between 21 June and 20 January. You will write exams on your first semester modules in May/June and your second semester examination is in November.
